



Commodore's Comments



Commodore's Comments

We had ambitious plans for our Spring Clean Up. Over 70 of our members came out to help and with this level of participation we managed to complete nearly all of the projects we had planned. A listing of those who made the Clean Up so successful is contained elsewhere in this issue. On behalf of the Board, I wish to thank again all who participated and if we missed listing your name, I apologize.

While it is always dangerous to cite a few individuals, since everybody there did a great job, I would be remiss if I didn't mention the extra efforts of Beth and John Marshall in organizing the painting of the old clubhouse, and of Mike Birk and his family in planning and carrying out many repairs to the exterior of the building. We have significantly improved the appearance of the old clubhouse, as we informed the Island Homeowners Association we would. We now have the responsibility to keep it looking good and free of clutter. I feel sure that all of us are proud of HIYC. The old clubhouse stands at the entrance of our club, and every time we turn into the club we should feel proud of what we see at the entrance. Let's keep it looking good.

We have now worked out an arrangement with the Island Homeowners Association to lease the Sailing Club Lot and old clubhouse through May of 2007 at the same terms we have been leasing it. This arrangement provided the incentive for us to invest a significant work effort into improving the appearance of the property. We are hopeful that maintaining a good appearance of the old clubhouse may lead to an acceptable resolution of use of this property.

Please plan to attend the Spring Quarterly Meeting on Sunday, May 7th. These are some of the issues needing attention that will be discussed, as will the 2006 budget:

1. Members have been restricted to the use of one slip. We are now reaching the limit on available mooring spaces and may need to restrict the number of boats that a member may keep in the water either in a slip or at a mooring.
2. The continuing erosion in the back parking and boat storage lot should be corrected in a permanent way, perhaps by ditching or more costly paving.
3. We have begun cleaning up the trailer storage area at the top of the hill. It may also become necessary to utilize this space as a boat work area and for the storage of infrequently used boats on trailers.
4. Some major improvements of the New Clubhouse need to be discussed.

Come and provide your thoughts and ideas on these issues.

Finally, a couple of incidents that occurred this Spring and last Spring involving HIYC boats serve as reminder that the Spring is a good time to think about boating safety. It is a good time to check into the condition of the boat which has sat idle for several months and to think realistically about the experience level of the friends we have invited to go sailing on a windy day. A little precaution now on these windy spring days that draw us out on the lake may result in many months of sailing fun this year rather than sailing regret. May we all have fair winds and good safe sailing,

**NOTICE TO MEMBERSHIP REGARDING THE PARKING OF BOATS IN
SLIPS OR AT MOORING.**

The authorized use of assigned slips and moorings owned by Harbor Island Yacht Club (HIYC) is governed by The HIYC Station Rules. **The Board of Governors encourages each member to become familiar with these rules** to ensure that all members have equal access to the club's boat parking places in the water or on land. The Club does not limit the number of boats that a member may own. However, our new lease with the U.S. Army Corp. of Engineers limits HIYC to forty moorings. Forty moorings limit the number of parking spaces available at HIYC. **During the next 30 days we request that each member who has more than one boat in the water or in a slip to move the additional boat (s) to a parking location on shore.** This volunteer effort will obviate the Board of Governors enacting rules to deal with the issue.

During this time-frame the Harbormaster (Roger Maxwell) will be working with the Vice Commodore (Ken Todd) and Club Secretary (Larry Boroviak) to "restructure the harbor" and complete the inspections of each mooring anchor to ensure that it provides a safe secure anchorage for the boat assigned and secured to it. The inspection includes a visual check by a diver of the anchor chain from the mooring ball to its anchor. This procedure will be repeated every two to three years on a rotating basis so that each mooring is inspected on a regular basis. Members are responsible for mooring lines (rope/chain) from the mooring ball to their boat. We encourage all members to inspect their mooring lines on an annual basis. **This is your responsibility.**

We welcome your comments and input in providing safe and convenient parking for the active members of HIYC
