

### **Useful Information for Those Traveling on the Cumberland River Mike Birk via Email**

Several of our members have asked me about the new transit dock that has been built on the river in Clarksville, so I thought this would be good information to put in the Anchor Line. The dock is located down town, just down stream of the rail road bridge and within walking distance of several restaurants. Reservations are required but there is currently no charge for overnight stay. There are no electrical hookups, fuel, or pump out facilities. To make reservations contact Jennifer at 931-645-7476. The information required is boat name and registration number.

## MARINES WASTE PUMP-OUT SYSTEM READY FOR USE

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency have provided 75% of the cost of a dockside pump-out system through a Clean Vessels Act Grant. The planning and approval process extended over several months, but use of the pump-out station should be in operation in April, as most of us get our boats ready to return to the lake.

The third slip on the right side of the Courtesy Dock has been designated by the HIYC Board for the pump-out of holding tanks and portable toilets on weekends. The hours of operation will be between 9:00 A.M. and 11:00 A.M. on Saturdays and between 4:00 P.M. and 6:00 P.M. on Sundays from April through November. Please plan ahead for your pump-out and confine it to these days and hours.

Then system is token-operated and tokens can be obtained from the Harbor Master or the Vice Commodore. The cost of a token is \$5.00 for boats with internal holding tank and \$2.00 for those boats with portable toilets. The funds collected will pay for the emptying of the onshore tank periodically and to establish a small reserve for maintenance of the system. Members with portable toilets are asked to use the pump-out system and not to put the sewage waste into the clubhouse toilets. This should improve the effectiveness of our septic field at the top of the hill.

Members will receive operating instructions to add to their HIYC Handbook. While the pump-out system is simple, please obtain instructions and a demonstration of its use from the Harbor Master, Dock Admirals or other members designated by the Board before you begin using the equipment.
