


# Join me in welcoming these new members to HIYC



## Sea Scout News

Within groups such as Harbor Island Yacht Club, Churches, golf clubs and the Sea Scouts you find two basic types of people. But this is ok as the kids got to race with other skippers which is something I like to encourage from time to time so they get a fresh perspective of how things are done.
